Learn about the effectiveness of partnerships between Cuyahoga Community College and Cleveland State University (four year public partner institution) and Baldwin Wallace University (four year private institution). The presentation will include information about our comprehensive partnerships and support services for transfer students including: Dual Admission programs such as A to BW between Cuyahoga Community College and Baldwin Wallace University, development of partnerships and articulation agreements and a number of effective pre transfer planning services including Gradfest events, Pre Transfer Planning appointments, tours of four year colleges/universities, and unofficial academic reviews to assist in transfer planning. Learn about the partnerships effectiveness in degree completion rates and success stories from transfer students.

Additional Information: Case studies will be presented along with data about Cuyahoga Community College student transfer patterns and GPA and completion rates of students who transfer from Cuyahoga Community College to four year public and private colleges/universities.

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## **Let's Flip Transfer Orientation (435N)**

Research indicates that transfer students tend to be less engaged at their new institution, Kirk-Kuwaye (2007). Orientation has been one strategy used to help new transfer students get acclimated to their new environment and help to foster engagement. However, transfer orientations tend to take a “checklist” approach to disseminating information which may hinder the intended outcomes. It does not allow for developing a sense of belonging or engagement. Flipping your transfer orientation program gives you the opportunity to provide content regarding next steps and resources students need via a virtual classroom. This frees up time during the campus visit to be more engaging and productive. This session will help participants understand how and why to flip their orientation and provide them concrete examples and resources.

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## **College Credit Plus (407)**

College Credit Plus has been a hot topic since it was first introduced into legislation. Now it has been in effect for a year; our session will focus on the implementation of the program. ## **John Davis — Author, Speaker, Coach, Action Hero**

John Davis is an internationally known Speaker, Comedian, Author and Action Hero. As an international entertainer, John has traveled extensively throughout the world speaking to audiences of all ages and backgrounds in 28 countries and over four thousand live performances. John encourages his audiences to set and reach their highest potentials and is often invited back as a peak performance coach.

Since the tragic events of September 11, 2001, John has dedicated a great amount of time bringing entertainment to the soldiers overseas. On six USO tours, John has performed more than one hundred shows and has taken his comedy to even the most remote bases in both Iraq and Afghanistan. He also attended the University of Delaware studying Architecture. John served as the Entertainment Director of four regional theme parks across the nation, where he developed a reputation for reversing negative trends. With John at the helm of both entertainment and marketing, the parks witnessed growths of up to 60% in a single year's time. Most recently he worked in partnership with Young Audiences of North East Ohio developing programs for schools on the subjects of Achievement, Bullying, and Shakespeare.

John is also highly respected fight director and is a recognized instructor with the International Order of the Sword and Pen, an organization that brings together instructors from around the globe who are renowned in both stage and film.

John is the owner of Corporate Action Hero where he provides keynotes, workshops, and coaching, for individuals and organizations. John is the proud father of his son Kynan and husband of his beautiful and talented wife Kelly. John has been featured on The Today Show and The Discovery Channel as well a dozen regional broadcasts and radio shows. He has authored the book "Signs Along The Path" and is about to release his new book, "Be an Action Hero NOT a Reaction Zero"
